Hello family,

This quarter, we mailed a donation of approximately \$631 to the Region. We are excited to share that CTANA now has its own newsletter, with the first edition available online at <https://ctana.org/newsletter/>

In fellowship development, we have begun scheduling a new monthly activity we are calling The Outreach Meeting. Led by our Outreach Coordinator, this effort brings together a group for a shared meal followed by attending a meeting that needs extra support. For now, we are starting with meetings that are located farther from our usual central locations.

We have also made strides in improving accessibility for recovering addicts who are deaf or hard of hearing by subsidizing the cost of a grassroots American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter service for the 'Here and Now' group. The home group members of 'Here and Now' led the charge on this issue with support from our Common Welfare subcommittee. They compiled a list of volunteer ASL interpreters who were willing to accept \$70 per meeting for their work, and were willing to stay after the meeting for a while to facilitate fellowship. This was a drastic improvement cost-wise compared to other options. They also began passing a second donation basket expressly for funding ASL interpreter services and have been collecting ~\$150/month. CTANA passed a proposal at our most recent meeting to subsidize the remainder of the monthly cost of this service. We will continue shoring up this financial support in the hopes that we can ensure that this meeting can become a permanent ASL interpreted meeting. On the fundraising front, we have successfully raised money by selling T-shirts, which has covered the cost of advertisements in the Austin Chronicle. We also hosted two well-attended talent shows this summer, along with a CTANA Anniversary Speaker Jam that drew an enthusiastic crowd.

Looking ahead, Miracles and Solutions will be holding their 32nd Anniversary Convention on August 28–30 in Austin. Registration is \$30, and rooms are available for \$110 per night at the Holiday Inn located at 6000 Middle Fiskville Rd. There are 42 groups total in Esperanza Area: 1 group holds 8 meetings weekly, 3 groups 7 meetings weekly, 2 groups hold 4 meetings a week, 2 groups 3 meetings a week, 13 groups meet twice a week and 22 groups meet once weekly

Also, Hayes County Jail has expedited the approval process for allowing members to join the H & I panel. It took several months previously and now it takes only a few days. A lot of women have been getting approval.

PR got their banner made for their table at the Recovery on the Plaza in San Marcos at the end of September. It's a large gathering of recovery related organizations and treatment centers. This will be the third year Hill Country will have a booth at this event.

We had one meeting this quarter that did not pertain to the Learning day. We have 5 to 7 Areas meeting monthly.

We have had a wonderful quarter. I had 5 to 9 areas attend all meetings we don't meet quarterly we voted to meet monthly. Our meetings are held on the last Sunday of the month at 7pm. Areas in attendance were STANA, HCANA, ESPRANZA, NORTH SIDE, HILL COUNTRY.

They Keep Plugging And Trying They Do Have 1 Facility That They Go Inot Once A Week. They Have Also Started Two New Meetings I The Livingstone Area.
- Hill Country : Is Currently Going Into 6 Facilities, And Going Strong
- Ctana : Is Going Into 12 Facilities And They Carry The Message 21 Times A Month And Is Going Strong. They Are Currently Planning Their Annual Book Drive. They Are Now Spending All Moneys Collected For Books On Books So That They Do Not Need To Go Through Their Areas For That Literture
- Stana : Is Currently Carrying In 4 Meetings A Week To 4 Facilities Eana Is Currently Going Into 12 Facilities And Carrying 38 Messages A Week They Are Also Planning Their Book Drive For October Around Holloween. They Have Raised Over 700 For Books Off A T Shirt Drive.
- Tcana : Is Currently Carring In 41 Meeting A Month To 11 Facilities. They Curently Have One Prison That Is Looking At Doing A Speaker Jam. This Is A Work In Progress And Mpre Will Be Revieled.
- All Areas Have Only One Complaint And That Is There Is Not Enough Trusted Servants To Carry The Message Into All The Facilities That Want H&I So The Hope Is That At The Learning Day We Will Get People Excited About Both H&I And Pi. All Areas Are Working On Building Relationships With The People Who Run The Facilities So That If There Is Issues Those Can Be Handled By The H&I Area Facilitor.
- Houston The Prison In Richmond Is Not Ready For Na To Come Into The Facility But They Are

I Spent 275 Dollars On The Venue For The Learning Day And Have Texted The Reciept To Tom. I Am Also Spending Another 100 Or So On The H&I Basics So That We Have Them To Orintate Everybody There On The Does And Donts And They Will Have A Book To Take With Them. The Event Will Also Have A Chili Cook Off So If You Think You Have A Winning Chili Bring It There Will Be Trophys For First Second And Third Place.
